Tarballs reached the coast of Texas that needed to be cleaned up, but over the next several years Mother Nature took care of the oil in the water, fisheries recovered and beaches were again supportive of life. There is incredible resiliency to our environment——it's our job to help the process in the most environmentally benign method possible (we don't want to do more damage doing the cleanup——that happened in Valdez when they steam cleaned beaches/rocks——it looked wonderful, but killed all of the little critters under the rocks).


