BP OIL GRANGEMOUTH REFINERY LIMITED, BP Grangemouth Complex, Bo'ness Road, Grangemouth, and BP CHEMICALS LIMITED, BP Grangemouth Complex, Bo'ness Road, Grangemouth

you are Indicted at the instance of the Right Honourable COLIN DAVID BOYD Esq. Queens Counsel, Her Majesty's Advocate, and the charges against you are that

BP CHEMICALS LIMITED, did fail to conduct your work undertaking, namely the operation of a medium pressure steam distribution system at the complex, steam being a necessary product for your various refinery and petrochemical manufacturing plants, part of said system being in close proximity to the public road A904 known as Bo'ness Road, Grangemouth in such a way as to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, that persons not in your employment who might be affected were not thereby exposed to risks to their health and safety, and in particular having modified said medium pressure steam distribution system by the reinstatement or bringing back into service of a pipeline after a period of disuse you failed to

(a) ensure that the operation of said pipeline was known to responsible operators and in particular the existence of said pipeline was not identified on the automated control system graphic displays of said system;

(b) follow relevant change management procedures for the whole of the reinstatement of said pipes;

(c) adequately investigate a serious steam system upset, following

flooding of water into a tunnel, through which said pipework passed, including water hammer of the said system pipework and steam condensate ejecting from a pressure relief valve close to the said Bo'ness Road in an area downstream of the South exit of said West tunnel on 30 May 2000;

- (d) take action to make the system safe following said system upset including by isolating the said pipework at source from the said steam distribution system and making integrity checks necessary to confirm that said steam system upset had not damaged the said pipework;
- (e) fail to ensure that a steam trap on said pipework at the South end of said tunnel which was necessary for removal of condensate from the low section of said pipework passing under said Bo'ness Road was not isolated on 5 June 2000 without adequate consideration of the effect on the safety of said system

and on 7 June 2000 at approximately 11.20pm of a T piece section of said pipeline on the South side of said Bo'ness Road at a point 2 metres from the boundary fence fractured, said fracture being due to overpressurisation of said section of pipework, by a mechanism involving condensate accumulation and thereby pedestrians and motorists using said Bo'ness Road were exposed to risks to their health and safety and Mrs Jean Lapsley-Carbis, c/o Central Scotland Police then a pedestrian walking in the vicinity of the area of said pipework fracture at the time of the fracture was injured.

CONTRARY to Section 3(1) of the Health and Safety at Work Etc Act 1974 and Section 33(1)(c) of the Health and Safety at Work Etc Act 1974.

(002) you BP OIL GRANGEMOUTH REFINERY LIMITED, did between 1 January 1987 and 10 June 2000, both dates inclusive, at the Fluidised Catalytic Cracking Unit at the BP Grangemouth Complex, Bo'ness Road, Grangemouth fail to ensure so far as is reasonably practicable the health, safety and welfare at work of all of your employees and in particular you did fail to provide and maintain so far as was reasonably practicable plant systems at work that were safe in that you failed to

- (a) ensure by adequate pipe work support or restraint or other means the mechanical integrity of a 75mm (3 inch) branch to the main transfer pipe work from the debutiniser column bottoms to the re-run column on the light end section of said fluidised catalytic cracking unit;
- (b) adequately review the effect and safety implications of numerous plant start ups within said period on the mechanical integrity of said light ends section and to provide such information and instruction training and supervision to employees operating said complex as was necessary to ensure said mechanical integrity was maintained;

and on 10 June 2000 said pipe work failed leading to a discharge of highly flammable liquid/vapour at an elevated temperature which liquid/vapour subsequently ignited resulting in a fire which caused damage to said Fluidised Catalytic Cracking Unit and danger to the health and safety of your employees and in particular to James Kenneth Fairley, Alexander Hugh Kilbride, Alexander Paul Martin, Derek Morrison and Graeme Spiers.
